We said: If you want peace, you must be prepared.

Great and courageous people of Iran—well done.

At the start of the third week of the new phase of Iran's national revolution, received reports confirm the Council's earlier analyses: given the regime's inability to resolve people's livelihood crises—especially amid the accelerating collapse of the national currency—and based on the Council's assessment of Ali Khamenei's character, it was foreseeable that without a shift in the balance of power in favor of the people, the deposed leader would not pursue a genuine compromise or transfer of usurped power, and that suppression would remain his primary option. Therefore, we note:

1. Our society's tendency toward exaggeration and the spread of false information can be misleading. Inflated casualty numbers may, on the one hand, intimidate protesters and empty the streets—serving the deposed leader's aims—and, on the other hand, be used by those who seek foreign intervention to push for attacks on Iran. Meanwhile, the record suggests foreign leaders act primarily based on their own national interests rather than a commitment to supporting a people's freedom.
2. The Council reiterates the importance of national solidarity and disciplined organization.
3. The Council previously warned that sabotage and destructive acts can be used to discredit the movement and provide a pretext for repression, and therefore calls for vigilance and preventing such provocations.

5. The need for capable leadership—grounded in competence, awareness, and commitment to Iran's territorial integrity, independence, and greatness—remains more pressing than ever.
6. Historical experience shows that mourning injustice is not enough; action is required to prevent it.
7. Continuity and perseverance are essential, but continuity does not require uniform, daily action without rest. A disciplined, periodic, and reliable schedule can prevent exhaustion, disorganization, and diversion by scattered slogans or unknown provocations. Therefore:
 - a) Peaceful, civilized nationwide protests should be held every Friday until full national solidarity and effective preparedness are achieved.
 - b) Strikes should continue and expand, and employees of public and non-governmental institutions should join.
 - c) Coordination among social groups and regions should be strengthened to ensure rapid, organized civic response if needed.
