Civic vigilance and national self-protection

Resilient people of Iran,

Based on earlier assessments, a prolonged state of instability following recent hostilities is fragile and risks paralyzing the country's public life. Unresolved objectives, regional tensions, and the presence of non-state armed actors increase the likelihood of renewed violence or mass harm to civilians.

Given credible risks to public safety—whether through spillover conflicts, proxy activities, or failures to protect civilians—the situation must be treated as an **imminent risk** requiring **preventive, lawful, and non-violent preparedness**. Protecting life, freedom, national unity, and territorial integrity is a shared responsibility of the state and society.

Accordingly, we call for:

1. **Maximum civic vigilance** and community-based protection of civilians.
2. **Non-violent civil organization**, emergency readiness, and lawful self-protection measures.
3. **Rejection of foreign interference** and the instrumentalization of humanitarian narratives for escalation.
4. **Accurate information**, de-escalation, and coordinated civil responses to prevent mass harm.

Safeguarding Iran's independence and the dignity of its people requires discipline, legality, and unity—**without resorting to violence**.
