The storm is coming. Help your helmsman!!

Do U.S. Marines, American warships, and British fighter jets come to the region to attend *Du 'ā Kumayl*?!

Militant People of Iran,

If it once took nearly a year to arrange logistics and transfer military equipment to the region for an attack on Iraq, then thanks to Khomeini's stupidity and his ignorance of international relations—and as a result of the eight-year war and Saddam's invasion of Kuwait—the West seized the opportunity and, under the banners of "humanitarian intervention" and "liberation," entrenched itself across the region as if it were a vast military garrison encircling Iran. Today, it can attack our country by air, sea, and land from all sides. We present the following points:

1. We have said before that the behavior of governments—even when illegal and illegitimate like the Islamic Republic—is ultimately charged to their people, and in the end it is the nations that pay the price for the abnormal conduct of their rulers, especially when it leads to war. That is, people were expected to prevent the harmful actions of their leader and government.
2. Iran's armed forces have accepted humiliation to such an extent that even a general cannot free himself from the control of a "two-bit cleric." Selection has been based solely on loyalty to the deposed leader, not on military competence—so much so that they are incapable of even the most basic military skills, such as assessing enemy forces or recognizing a glaring imbalance of power and the absence of a balance of forces. They have been degraded to the point that, in the first hours of the 12-day assault, Israel hunted their leaders in their bedrooms; and, by the admission of the illegitimate commander-in-chief, foreigners infiltrated the country and killed thousands of our compatriots—while Iran's armed forces either merely watched or even collaborated with the enemy against their own people.
3. If—purely hypothetically—we accept the deposed leader's statements and the Martyrs Foundation's claim that the total number of those killed in the recent protests was 3,117 and that only 2,427 are considered "martyrs," this would mean that 77.86% were regime agents allegedly killed by foreigners or by "protesters"!! What grade can be given to such armed forces?
4. Do the armed forces not want to save themselves, the nation, and the country from humiliation, destruction, and disgrace by joining the people—or are they waiting for Trump, Netanyahu, and Starmer to subject Iran to the fate of Iraq and Libya, and the armed forces to the fate of Saddam's and Gaddafi's armies?! By joining the people, can commanders not remove the pretext for so-called "humanitarian intervention" by foreign powers—so that they themselves, the nation, and the country are not harmed—especially now that Trump has said: "People, take to the streets; our help is on the way"??
5. Is there any prospect of improving people's livelihoods, especially under current threats and increasing sanctions?! Should we allow the deposed leader to drag the country, the nation,

and the armed forces down with him?! Is there not even a single Khaled Islambouli within the armed forces?!

6. Should Khamenei the bloodthirsty escape accountability for all these crimes?! Do the people and the armed forces, after bearing such heavy human and material costs, consider themselves so exempt from struggle that they wait for foreign armies?! Have we learned nothing from the invasions by the Arabs and the Ba‘athist army?!
7. As we have stated before, the only way to prevent war, surrender, and the degeneration caused by religious despotism is a **national uprising**, under conditions of **urgency and necessity**—which itself requires complete national unity, a roadmap, organization, discipline, and more. Preparing these largely falls upon the **management of the national uprising**, and we are striving to realize it; but the success of our efforts depends on the **support and cooperation** of the great people of Iran.

A nation that fails to recognize its decisive moments and does not fulfill its national responsibility in time should not blame others for its misfortunes.
