### **Statement No. 78 – SHAMA This Fire Cannot Be Extinguished**

Students of Iran,

History shows that student movements often rise from the ashes of repression. Even when suppression attempts to silence voices, intellectual awakening cannot be extinguished.

Today, Iranian students stand at a critical moment. Recent tragic events and ongoing economic hardship have intensified public concern. Universities—long regarded as centers of awareness and civic responsibility—once again find themselves at the forefront of national reflection.

We emphasize the following:

1. Many underlying causes that led to recent unrest remain unresolved. Economic instability and social grievances continue to generate tension.
2. With millions of students across the country, the academic community represents one of the most organized and aware sectors of society. Its moral voice carries weight far beyond campus walls.
3. Past civic movements faced setbacks partly due to fragmentation, lack of coordination, and absence of sustained organization. Future efforts must learn from those experiences.
4. Sustained civic engagement must remain peaceful, disciplined, and strategically thoughtful. Non-violent civil resistance—grounded in responsibility and national solidarity—reduces the risk of further bloodshed.
5. Students traditionally reject all forms of authoritarianism and support pluralism, national dignity, and independence from foreign interference.
6. The objective must be to prevent chaos, avoid civil conflict, and protect the territorial integrity and long-term stability of Iran.

The path forward requires unity, clarity of purpose, disciplined organization, and peaceful civic action. Universities can serve as catalysts for national awareness—without contributing to instability or violence.

The future of Iran belongs to its people. Let wisdom and responsibility guide this critical moment.
