The Issue Is the Prevention of Iran's Return to Its Historic Greatness

People of Iran,

Recent statements in Western political discourse suggest concerns that, should Iran successfully navigate its present crisis, it could re-emerge as a significant and influential regional power. Regardless of the outcome of current negotiations, geopolitical competition and strategic pressure are likely to continue.

In this sensitive historical moment, we submit the following reflections:

1. Student protests across Iranian universities demonstrate civic vitality, yet the risk of escalation remains real. Sustainable change requires disciplined, non-violent civic coordination rather than confrontation that may lead to repression.
2. History shows that fragmentation weakens national movements. Broader social participation—grounded in peaceful civic engagement—can strengthen solidarity while minimizing harm.
3. Legal professionals traditionally hold a central role in safeguarding constitutional principles and civil rights. Their commitment to the rule of law remains critical during periods of political uncertainty.
4. Teachers and educators, as moral anchors within society, carry a responsibility to foster awareness, critical thinking, and national cohesion.
5. National unity—not division—forms the strongest safeguard against both internal authoritarianism and external interference.

Iran stands at a critical juncture. Decisions made today will shape its sovereignty, dignity, and future stability.

Great nations require wise, measured, and courageous choices rooted in independence and collective responsibility.
